

Job Title: Environmental Fellow

Summary: We are looking for a passionate and dedicated individual interested in joining our team as a paid Environmental Fellow in Coachella, California. The ideal candidate is keen on pursuing a career in conservation and has a strong interest in natural history, environmental education, and community engagement.

The candidate should be open to learning and adapting to new challenges, work in a collaborative and team-oriented environment, and have excellent communication and interpersonal skills to engage with stakeholders and build lasting relationships.

This position combines in-person field and classroom sessions, remote independent work, and a four-day camping trip.

Responsibilities:

Assist course instructors and other program staff with implementing the Nuestro Desierto California Naturalist educational program. Some of the responsibilities include;

- Assist with outreach and marketing efforts
- Drive passenger vehicles to and from program related locations
- Assist with in-person classroom sessions
- Assist with outdoor field classes, hikes, and camping trips
- Assist with other education components of the Nuestro Desierto Program for school groups and the public
- Collecting feedback from students to generate reports

- Must report to Conservation Program Manager

Qualifications:

- A bachelor's degree or similar experience in natural resources, environmental science, outdoor education, or a related field is required.
- Must be available to participate in all planned 2024 Nuestro Desierto Program activities, which include the following dates:
 - Classroom lectures: June 1, June 29, July 27, August 24 (Saturdays)
 - Field Classes: June 15, July 13, August 10 (Saturdays)
 - Camping Trip: September 12-15
 - Graduation Ceremony: October 26 (Saturday)
- A clean driving record and a valid California Driver's License.
- Familiarity with local natural history, ecology, and conservation
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team
- Passion for our environment and building community
- Ability to walk/hike on uneven terrain
- Ability to lift, carry, or pull 20 pounds (camping gear and program supplies and

- equipment)
- Bilingual in English and Spanish (or other language) preferred but not required
 - In compliance with federal law, all persons hired will be required to verify identity and eligibility to work in the United States and to complete the required employment eligibility verification form upon hire.

Compensation:

- \$20 per hour
- 5 Month paid internship

This is a part-time, temporary, at-will, non-exempt position that is grant-funded and expected to last until October 31, 2024, but may be extended based on the funding available. The position is contingent on the programs' deliverables and the funds available. Our office hours are Monday through Friday, 8 am-4:30 pm; however, occasional work on weeknights and/or weekends and at various locations will be required based on the course syllabus. The estimated average number of work hours per month is 40.
